

## NCHU Hugs During Covid-19 Pandemics

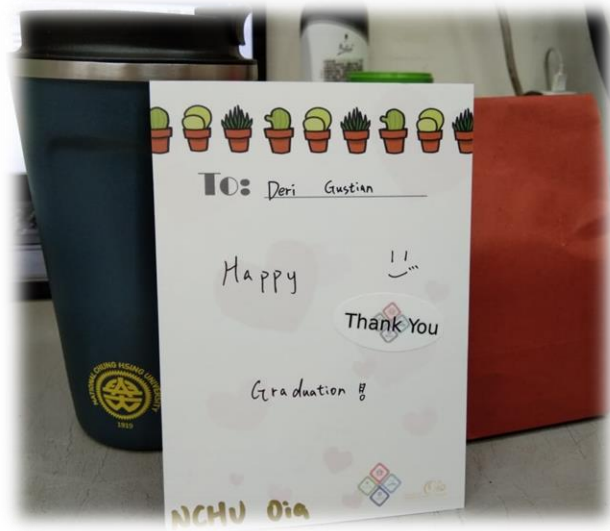
