Since I was a child, I always wondered "Why are so many people coming to Taiwan to work and send so much money back to their families in Vietnam?". When I went to high school, had more chances to use the Internet, and was able to learn more about Taiwan by myself, I asked myself, "Why can Taiwan develop the economy and maintain culture so well at the same time?". Taiwan and National Chung Hsing University (NCHU) are a whole new horizon to me. This country not only has developed industry, but also extremely modern agriculture. IMPA students will have a variety of

Therefore, I not only focus on my topics about agritourism but also have the opportunity to expand my knowledge in many different fields. Each week my class has an interesting seminar where students from different fields give presentations on their research topics, such as postharvest of mango, seaweed, the influence of plastic in the soil, some people study marketing, supply chain management. In general, diversity and quality are IMPA's advantages and that is the reason why I chose this program.

The second thing that makes me impressed about NCHU is that the school is always equipped with **the most modern facilities** for students' learning, discussion, and entertainment. The library and the sports complex are my favorites. NCHU's library is the largest and most modern library I've ever been to. Not only does it have thousands of valuable books, written in many languages and many different fields, our library also has a computer room, conference room, and a free multimedia entertainment room for students. As a student of NCHU you not only need to learn about professional knowledge, you are also encouraged to become more comprehensive both physically and mentally.
